

## MINUTES OF SFBAC NATS

Meeting held May 24, 2009 at the home of Wendy Hillhouse

Meeting called to order at 2:30 PM by President Wendy Hillhouse

President's Report:

The SFBAC annual Meeting will be held at 4:30 PM at the San Francisco Conservatory. Annual meeting attendees will be able to attend also the Lieder Alive master class given by Marilyn Horne at 6 PM at the Conservatory.

Wendy suggested that we have a chapter party in July, however Sunday, August 2, the day before the beginning of the August workshop, was determined to be the best day for the party.

There is a necessity for a review of this year's Singing Festival. The date of this review is TBA, and will be given by e-mail to all interested members.

The Performance Workshop for Singers will be August 3-7 at the MCCPA in Santa Clara. Wendy Hillhouse and Sharon Kaye will be co-chairs. A panel of South Bay teachers and directors is to be recruited, and 2 accompanists will be hired. Tuition will cover the cost of the program.

Sue Field is looking for a replacement for her position of program chair. Joshua Elder will be replaced by Anja Strauss as newsletter editor.

All Board members are urged to make a binder describing the position he/she holds in detail (particularly logistic detail) which can be given to the next person to hold that position.

SF State would like for us to use them again for our Singing Festival.

The next Board meeting will be Sunday, August 9 at 3:00 - 4:30 PM. Possible dates for future board meetings were discussed. The following suggestions will be sent to the Board for comments: Oct. 4, Jan. 24, March 14 and May 2.

Recitals Report: Not much info to report. I am currently in contact with 3 possible new Recital Coordinators. Hopefully we will have some new venues to look forward to. Also, with a record number of Festival participants, I still wonder why more of these singers are not performing in our student recitals? I will keep on posing this question to the chapter.

Membership report: To date we have 144 active members, 12 of whom have emeritus status. Appreciation is expressed to Dorothy Barnhouse who phoned 41 members who had not paid by the February 1 deadline for membership renewal. Of these 15 paid right away, 10 promised to pay (3 still unpaid), 5 wanted to let membership lapse, 7 initiated application for emeritus status. We gained 11 new members in 2008-2009; they will be listed in the new directory. It was suggested that street addresses be included in the Directory in its next edition. There are several concerns: the need to remind members to pay their dues on time; the need to be more consistent about when to drop members who have not paid dues; the problems caused by confusing and inconsistent membership reports from national NATS; the need for a better system for depositing dues checks.

Newsletter report: Apologies that the May newsletter was late. The June Newsletter will cover June, July and August and will be my last newsletter. Even though I'm sorry that I have

to leave the post early, I am very glad that I took it on! I want to encourage other members to try serving on the Board, to do their part and get involved, etc. It has been a learning experience for me, I certainly am glad that I did it and I have every intention of coming back to work on the Board (perhaps in a different position) when my family / professional life become more balanced. Before the meeting Tina sent a proposal to the Board Google Group requesting additional funding for the "Air Is A Gift" DVD. There was a discussion about whether or not this was appropriate for SFBAC-NATS to consider. After the discussion, Tina decided not to submit the proposal to the full board for a vote.
